Oet 18/9 Our Tent Dear Lad, Wother and Vienon; d was very glad to get your letter yesterday afternoon, it sumed like such a long time since I had heard from you folks. However I was very fortunale yesterday in getting 2 letters from Genevier of I from Henry + 01 and yours, so that made 4. This morning I got a letter from funni dted, also a box of Rice - Kriggi bars and the Capital so you see I have been doing that Uncle Find had died - certainly was shock to you folks since you had just then there and he had seemed so well. hems very shange that I won't see him again but I suppose his task or earth was finished". He certainly followed mama very som, I don't suppose aunt Minnie will be around home long but in case she is - had will you give her my sympathy; I would have tropped her a card

but I didn't know her address. I noticed by your letter that you are putty busy well I am too! They really keep us hopping around here. We get up in the morning at 6:15 - that is when the whistle blows and in 10 mins we have to be doned t in rank to stand reveille at 6:25. Then we get cleaned up - make our beds shine our shows of clean up tent and have breakfast and have tent inspection and we have assembly at 7:30; then We have Calisthems and they really are strenums exercises. Then marching for an home and then some instruction it then dinner and then in the afternoon some more drill of instruction of lectures until 4:15. Then we have an how to get cleaned up, and show and shine our shoes and have personal inspection at retreat, Soyan can easily see what we do to keep busy. This past week I drove an army "4 wheel drive truck and spent several hours studying the big gums and studied the defeur portions of the different men in fewing one of the gum - it takes to men to great on flhon 75 mm guns

However in actual warfare we don't greate the gum - we aren't even near them. We're outon some high hill where we can see the enemy or some target and by using instrument we know how far it is away and in what duection and we send this calculations drun to the gues which may be far away and then they short the gun - so you sie we have mostly brain work in this Battery E" You asked about when the Fort Sillis.
