ACADEMIC CREDIT: Northwestern College offers six hours of undergraduate credit in connection with this tour. Basically, the credit offered is in Speech 300, but by special prior arrangement, the credit may also be applied to courses in English or Humanities. Tuition fees are \$40.00 per credit hour. Northwestern is fully accredited and credit granted may be transferred to other colleges. Northwestern offers a major and a minor in Speech and Drama. If credit for the tour is desired, students will attend regularly scheduled seminars during the tour. At the end of the tour the student will prepare a paper, on a topic previously approved by the instructor, and will submit it by October 14, 1972.
