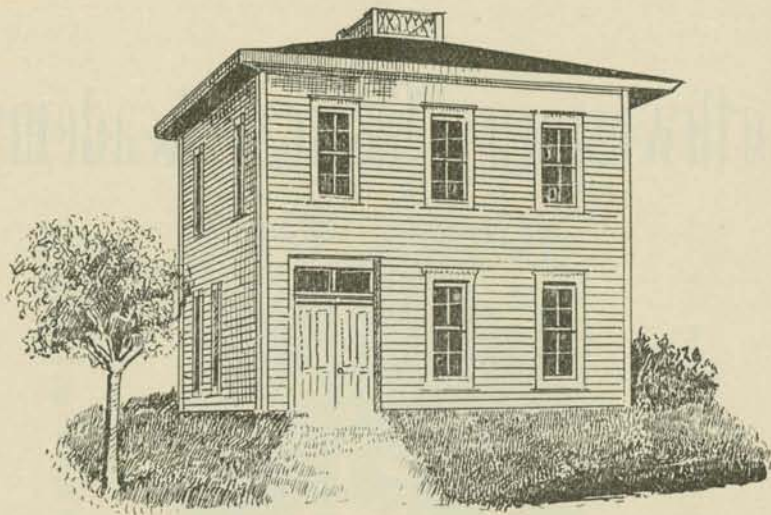

THE PIONEER SCHOOL.

This building was erected in 1883, by donations secured in "the colony."

In 1890 it was entirely remodelled, and enlarged, into a commodious residence for the Principal. The necessary means for this improvement were solicited from the Women's Ex. Committee of the B. D. M., of the Reformed church, and from other friends of the Academy.

EXAMINATIONS.

At the close of each term, or when a study is finished, the students will be examined. Preference is given to written examinations. The classification of the students will be contingent upon the value of their examination papers and their general standing, as indicated by the records of the teachers.

SOCIETIES.

The Philomathean, a literary society composed of students, numbering 59 members, holds weekly meetings; and materially aids in the attainment of that culture which the Academy aims to promote.

A monthly, called "The Northwestern Classic," is conducted by the students, and is meeting with gratifying success.

THE LIBRARY AND APPARATUS.

The library consists of about 2,000 volumes, among which a complete set of the American Cyclopædia, and other valuable books of reference, including an entire, and substantially bound, set of Harper's Monthly Magazines, will be found especially helpful to students.

A Holtz Electric Machine, Leyden Jar, Induction Coil, Plunge Batteries, etc., are beginning to supply the need of apparatus.

We hope, that Maps, Charts, Instruments, as well as books, will be supplied by the graduates and friends of the Institution.
