A Chronology of Northwestern College

- 1928—The Junior College is established upon approval of General Synod, and the institution is named Northwestern Junior College and Academy. Thirty students are enrolled in the freshman class, and the college is formally opened on September 5.
- 1928—Rev. Jacob Heemstra is installed as President of the Junior College and Principal of the Academy.
- 1928-The Northwestern Beacon is founded.
- 1928—The Women's Auxiliary is organized.
- 1930—The two-year Normal Course in the Junior College is accredited by the State Board of Public Instruction.
- 1931—The Junior College becomes a member of the American Association of Junior Colleges.
- 1931—The General Synod adopts the Junior College department as an accredited Junior College of the Reformed Church in America.
- 1940—Plans are made for building a Girls' Dormitory.
- 1943—The Board of Trustees is enlarged under the new Articles of Incorporation of Northwestern Junior College and Academy.


