Sud fall in answer to your question concerning when work & considered finished around here, well on Wed and Saturday we are finished at noon provided there is no extra-work to be done. Other days of the week we finish at approximately 5:30 p.m. Light go out at 9 P.M. and we have to be in Bed at 10:30 p.m. or else we get extra K.P. Have had quite a week this past

wieh. Studied quite a bit and also had an exam! I managed to get

a 96% which was quite well, the

test was comparatively simple though and I should have gotten a perfect score - but I am natisfied.

We went out to the Range on Tuesday and observed the fire of the 75 mm guids They were firing at tangets 2: mile away and we were Soewing the hets through strong glasses and telescoper. We were a lettle behind the guns. Those guns make quite a noise and belch quite a flame Geally was quite interesting since it was the first time I had been near by guns when they were actually fiving. Had a very med Thanksgiving. don't suppose it was the gayed I have ever had but I'm certain I realized more than before how much I had to be thankful for . We marched to church in the maning behind a band. Lervice were held in the theatre to accomadate the large number ofmen. about 1000 men was at the service and we really had a very mil service: at IRM we had our thanksgiving dinner - Really was some dinner, first then there was candied siteets platoes an 8TH TRAINING REGIMENT
