I am getting along just fine and feel quite
well. Lately we have been quite busy
as you may well imagine. However
progress has been excellent so we don't mind
the hard work. The country is very pretty, especially
since spring has set in. Now that we are
moving so rapidly there is less destruction.
All these houses are built of stone but they
appear quite modern and have the modern
conveniences. At present we are well over half
the way across Germany. We were all shocked
to hear of the President's death - have undoubtedly
lost one of the greatest Presidents we ever had.
