Air Mail

13 October '44
Germany

Dear folks;

Today evening and since I have a few minutes I will answer your letter that I got yesterday.

As yet I am still getting along just fine. Still have a little cold but otherwise am o.k.

You asked in your letter concerning what ~~the~~ commander we were under - Not directly under the one you mentioned. I haven't seen Holland so have been unable to see your mother and father's place. I may get a chance sometime. Today another of my August issues of the Capital came. It's always

good to read all the old
names and places even though
it's a little old.

I'm sure glad you were able
to get me a box at the bank.
As to keeping the key well
you can Dad and if Jennie
has anything she wants to put in
it. She can borrow the key from
you — that way you have
a place to put the bonds.
Incidentally I changed my
war bonds too it's still the
same amount but then from
September or October will have
you as the co-owner instead
of the beneficiary as the old ones
were. So you can cash them
if you need money.
