Introduction

The American Legion Women's Auxiliary, John C. Pressman Post, Orange City, IA collection provides a glimpse into the pride and work of its members from 1921-2021. Records of the collection include booklets, newspaper articles, constitutions, booklets explaining bylaws, annual reports, awards, several personalized thank-you cards, applications, letters, and financial records/statements. Additionally, ledgers and secretary notes are included. Collectively, these records showcase the important work of the Legion Auxiliary, including its fundraising efforts for hospital equipment, children in need, and veterans.

<u>Size:</u> 26 cm

<u>Provenance:</u> Creators of these records include numerous members and officers of the Orange City, IA Legion Auxiliary chapter. Items from the State level are also included. These records were donated by Bonnie Meier in March of 2021.

<u>Restrictions:</u> Conditional. Researchers must agree to respect the privacy of personal information in any use of the collection material.

Historical Notes

The American Legion nationally was organized in 1919, initially as a World War I veterans' organization; the Pressman Post of Orange City was organized the same year. The American Legion Women's Auxiliary, Pressman Post, was founded in 1921-1922, only months after the first Department of Iowa convention of the Legion's Women's Auxiliary was held in Sioux City in May, 1921. Fundraising efforts included the sale of poppies, magazine subscriptions, even white elephant and knives sales. Funds were primarily used to provide hospital equipment (beds, trapeze bars, walkers) and parts for Iron Lungs (Spiralocks).

Many early members took their duties seriously and stressed the importance of serving their country in this manner. Membership and participation were strongly encouraged and can be felt through the letters of this collection.
