We had to pack every thing and then there was numerous things to plan for the trys. you have no lidea just how much planning it takes to mor a unit of a little over a thousand men with all their belongings We had to make all kinds I inspections to be certain the ada was clean before in left - the army always leaves things cleaner than when found

Sunday morning in got up at thu o'clock so that we could get started at 60' clack. The Stap really ran its legs of getting things in order for march between 3 and 6! But everything was ready at appointed time mountains very much. The scenery was just marvelous. Unother Staff member and Myself roche with the Camel and hegt the column in order. We stored at Summit which is a very top of mountains to let estermin go by so I got a sew picture which probably comt tichn out so well since we were surrounded with clouds. They were several seal her skiing and the snow was several ful deep.

We had a portable radio in our can so we heard the Christmas Cardo eming over the mountains. I was the first time Joe heard them this year server in didn't have a radio and no church service We finally arrived here at about seven o'clock last night.
